1. REVIEW OF AGENDA

The agenda was approved as circulated.

2. REVIEW OF MINUTES AND BUSINESS ARISING

a) Draft Minutes of the Meeting held on November 18, 2008

4. CURRICULUM ITEMS

a) Education Council Meeting held November 4, 2008

L. Cullen noted that Education Council approved the curriculum for the Bachelor of Performing Arts program and everything is in place, including admission requirements, for student intake.

As part of a retention initiative to encourage students to complete their first two years at Langara, Geography and Chemistry have added new second-year courses. There are no items with financial implications.

5. INFORMATION ITEMS

a) VANOC

N. Wickham distributed a document at the table titled "Suggestions for Community Contributor Emblem Usage Received from Langara Council, December 2008" (as attached to these minutes) and highlighted the suggestions received from Council members. After much discussion, it was agreed that a form of the document be posted on the Langara website in order to ensure that VANOC guidelines on emblem usage and the approval process are understood by all college employees. Two VANOC documents titled "Community Contributor Contained Emblem Graphic Standards" and "Protecting the Brand" are available on the employee intranet.

b) Accountability Reports: Presentation of Survey Results

L. Xiong referred to an information package distributed at the table (as attached to these minutes) and provided an overview of various student survey results. These reports are presented annually at the Administration and Finance Committee of the College Board and more detailed reports are available at the Institutional Research page on the Langara website. In response to a question, L. Xiong noted that he would create a graph that shows the breakdown of Langara's successful transfer students to the three major universities over the past three years.

c) Release of Operating Capital Budgets

As noted at the Administration and Finance Committee meeting held on November 18, 2008, D. Douglas reported that Operating Capital has been released.

Other

Relative to a meeting with the Ministry held on November 24, 2008, D. Ross announced that the Ministry of Advanced Education (MAE) changed its name to the Ministry of Advanced Education and Labour Market Development (ALMD); work is complete on the Campus 2020 report; the incorporation of the Public Sector Employers' Council (PSEC) into the new Ministry of Advanced Education and Labour Market Development, and Robin Ciceri, Deputy Minister, as its Chair;; University Presidents Council of BC changed its name to Research Universities' Council of British Columbia (RUCBC) as a result of reorganization; the Capital Planning Secretariat, as part of Treasury Board, will be required to approve any new major capital requests and all requests will be considered together regardless if they are from education, health care, or transportation; and, two budget scenarios will be required next year – one more optimistic than the other.

There being no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 1045 hours.

Suggestions for Community Contributor Emblem Usage Received from Langara Council, December 2008

Background:

The following are available on the College intranet (Employee Tab in myLangara):

- Protecting the Brand
- Community Contributor Graphic Standards
- Approval time is 10 days per cycle, and in many instances approvals take 2 cycles (web for example)
- The homepage and Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympic Games microsite have been approved, and emblem is posted.

The suggestions for emblem usage can be sorted into 4 categories:

The "no, we are not permitted to do this" category:

- resale items, eg Bookstore items
- Falcons' uniforms
- promo items which don't allow for the minimum emblem size (eg, pens)

The "yes, we are able to do this" category:

- letterhead (there are several letterhead versions in use)
- business cards
- College publications produced by CM (including web)
- Courseware
- Registration Guide
- HR recruitment advertising
- Specialty and premium items (bookmarks, shirts as gifts (not resale), etc.)

The "no, we are not able to do this at this time" category:

- emails for everyone (earliest would be next upgrade to Sun Java System CE 6.3)
- sign on west 49th Ave

The "yes, we are able to do this but do we have the resources (fte and approval time) to do so" category:

- internal course promotion posters
- selected use of the email graphic

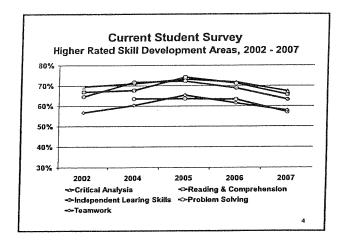

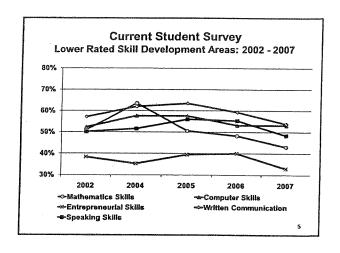

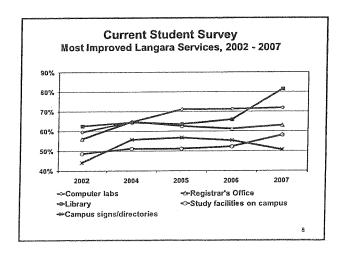
2007 Current Student Survey First Impressions

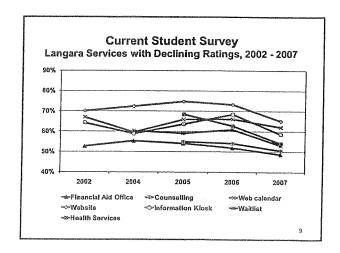
- Students attend Langara because:

- Given a chance to start over, 86% would 'definitely' or 'probably' attend Langara again

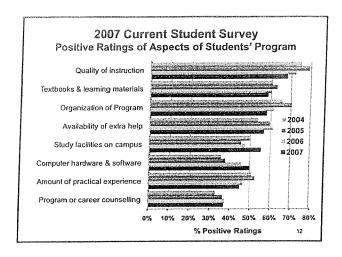

Provincial Former Student Outcomes Survey

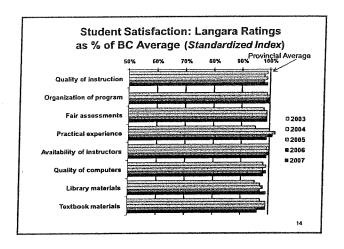
2007 survey coverage: students who left Langara between July 2005 and June 2006.

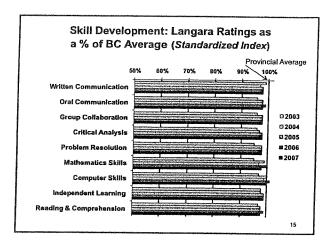

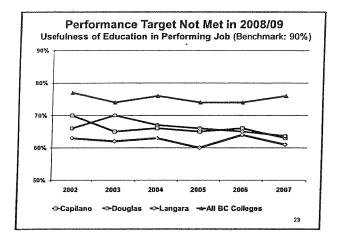


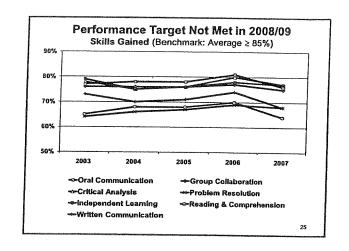


Langara College Accountability Plan and Report

- The Ministry has commended our design, accuracy and level of detail.

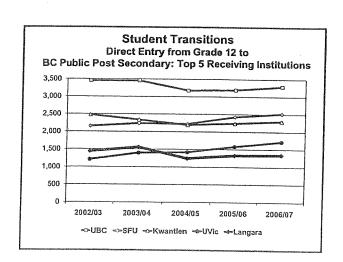

Transfer Information

- Langara participates in the BC Council on Admissions & Transfer (BCCAT) Student Transitions Project, which examines the mobility of students within BC's public education system
- SFU and Langara have also produced some independent research this year

Student Transitions Direct Entry from Grade 12 to Langara 2001/02-2006/07

- Langara accepted more direct-entry students than any other BC College or Institute
- * 83% of BC secondary students who went to Langara did so within 1 year, and another 12% within 2 years.
- The most popular program areas for direct entry students: Arts & Sciences (89%); Visual, Performing & Fine Arts; and Business.
- Average high-school GPA of Langara direct-entry students: 72% (Among Urban colleges: Highest --Camosun 75%, Lowest -- VCC 71%).
